During a time when researchers who work with human subjects are under the microscope, the National Patient Safety Foundation once again is bringing together leaders in the research community to tackle difficult issues. Specific topics to be addressed include: Informed Consent in Light of Genetics and Patient Privacy; Conflict and Confluence of Interests in Clinical Research; Bioterrorism Research and the Challenge of Preserving Patients' Rights; and Accreditation and Certification: Creating an Ethical Climate for Research. The conference also will explore how to preserve the privacy and dignity of research subjects and listen to research participants and patient advocacy groups. It will open with a videotaped address from clinical trial participant Christopher Reeve and will offer many opportunities for audience participation over the three days.
