wenty-five is an interesting number: 2 bits, quarter century, silver anniversary, peak of youth, or even the end of youthful indiscretion! Twenty-five years ago, there was a new expanding trend in the world of dermatology that had begun to take hold, especially in private practices; this trend was the logical outgrowth of advances made especially in surgical dermatology. Here, the combination of postoperative reconstruction and greater attention to aesthetic outcome in skin cancer patients resulted in increasing surgical skills for dermatologists. The introduction of early laser technology, advances in the understanding of skin biology, and the influence of topical agents were added to the existing repertoire of collagen injections, hair transplants, chemical peels, and dermabrasion. A new subspecialty in dermatology—cosmetic dermatology—was emerging, combining the diagnostic and treatment acumen of the medical dermatologist with the technical skills of the dermatologic surgeon as well as focusing on the enhancement of skin health and appearance, rejuvenation of the aging face, and restoration of photodamaged skin. The only thing missing was a way to communicate on a peer-to-peer basis through a professional printed format known as the medical journal.

The journal *Cosmetic Dermatology*® was launched 25 years ago. "Cos Derm," as it is often affectionately nicknamed, was the venue to educate, communicate, express opinions, and learn about the rapid advances occurring in the new subspecialty of cosmetic dermatology. The original Medical Editor Richard B. Odom, MD, began the process that continues today. Now that the world of aesthetic medicine, including cosmetic dermatology, has
